Connect with One Another:



FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT READINGS

Isaiah 9:2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.

You have multiplied the nation; You have increased its joy; they rejoice before You as with joy at the harvest, as they are glad when they divide the spoil.

And in this place I will give peace, declares the LORD of hosts."

CONFESSING OUR FAITH TOGETHER

Westminster Shorter Catechism Q&A 21,22,27,28

M: Who is the Redeemer of God's elect?

P: The only Redeemer of God's elect is the Lord Jesus Christ, who, being the eternal Son of God, became man, and so was, and continues to be, God and man in two distinct natures, and one person, forever.

M: How did Christ, being the Son of God, become man?

P: Christ, the Son of God, became man, by taking to Himself a true body, and a reasonable soul, being conceived by the power of the Holy Ghost, in the womb of the virgin Mary, and born of her, yet without sin.

M: Wherein does Christ's humiliation consist?

P: Christ's humiliation consisted in His being born, and that in a low condition, made under the law, undergoing the miseries of this life, the wrath of God, and the cursed death of the cross; in being buried, and continuing under the power of death for a time.

M: Wherein consists Christ's exaltation?

P: Christ's exaltation consists in His rising again from the dead on the third day, in ascending up into heaven, in sitting at the right hand of God the Father, and in coming to judge the world at the last day.


