

Connect with One Another:



NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURE READING

1 Corinthians 12:1-11

Elder Philip Suh

¹ Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers, I do not want you to be uninformed. ² You know that when you were pagans you were led astray to mute idols, however you were led. ³ Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking in the Spirit of God ever says "Jesus is accursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except in the Holy Spirit.

⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸ For to one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, ⁹ to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰ to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹ All these are empowered by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as He wills.

CORPORATE CONFESSION OF SIN

P: Our Merciful Father in Heaven, We praise You that Your love in Christ is without measure.

For we confess to You our sins of omission and commission, the sins that we know about and those we don't.

We plead no righteousness of our own, but cling to the finished work of Jesus, which needs no addition from our doings, and is satisfaction for all our sins.

In that name we plead and give thanks, Amen.

SILENT CONFESSION OF SIN

In these moments, we confess our personal sins to God so that we may take hold of the forgiveness won for us by Christ, our Redeemer.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON

2 Corinthians 5:21

For our sake He made Him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God To all who turn from sin in sorrow, to all who turn to God in hope, this is God's Word of grace: In Jesus, you are accepted, you are forgiven, you are loved.

READING OF THE WORD

Exodus 20:1-15

- ¹ And God spoke all these words, saying,
- ² "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.
- ³ You shall have no other gods before Me.
- ⁴ You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. ⁵ You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate Me, ⁶ but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love Me and keep My commandments.
